## **COVID-19** update

Auckland, Northland and parts of Waikato remain at Alert Level 3. The rest of New Zealand are at Alert Level 2.

## **Testing**

Anyone with cold, flu or COVID-19 symptoms are being advised to call Healthline, their GP or iwi health provider for guidance on whether they should get a COVID-19 test. The latest case definition and clinical guidelines for who should get a test are available here.

Pop-up testing centres have been set up in Hamilton, Huntly, Te Awamutu, Ngaaruawaahia and Ootorohanga. Drive through sites, which do not need bookings, are available in Hamilton city. ## Vaccinations update

Everyone in New Zealand who is 12 years and over are eligible to get a vaccination. This includes everyone, no matter what their immigration status. People can book their vaccines online at Book My Vaccine – www.bookmyvaccine.nz – or by calling the COVID Vaccination Healthline on 0800 28 29 26 from 8am-8pm seven days a week. People do not have to wait for an invitation to book once they are eligible. Interpreters are available for people who ask. Please remember whaanau Maaori and Pacific families can be vaccinated together when one member of the family is eligible to be vaccinated.

## **Super Saturday**

Super Saturday on the 16 October 2021 was very successful, with 130,002 vaccinations delivered across Aotearoa New Zealand and 10,103 total vaccinations given out in the Waikato. 21,702 Maaori people across Aotearoa New Zealand received their vaccinations and 2,558 in the Waikato.



## The COVID-19 Protection Framework

The Government has announced the next stage of the COVID-19 response plan to provide a pathway out of lockdown and give vaccinated New Zealanders more freedom.

Once 90% of eligible New Zealanders are fully vaccinated and protected, the COVID-19 Protection Framework introduces a new flexible three-level approach to managing COVID-19 in the community:

- Green
- Orange
- Red

Testing, contact tracing, and isolation will continue as key tools to minimise any spread of the virus.


